“Customers who usually receive service on Monday will instead receive it Tuesday, and so on throughout the week, with Friday’s customers receiving service on Saturday,” said David Ross, director of community and municipal relations for Waste Management of Orange County. “We appreciate our customers’ cooperation with the holiday schedule so that all of our employees can observe Memorial Day.”

All Waste Management of Orange County operations will be closed, including transfer stations in Irvine and Orange, on Monday, May 30, with normal operations resuming on Tuesday, May 31.
